
Coach Guidance

- Our primary goal is to run an enjoyable and safe Championships for the athletes, but we are reliant
 on you to help us achieve this.

- We understand there are now no Covid-19 rules or regulations.
- There is no requirement to wear facemasks in Sport Wales nor is it necessary to socially distance from one another. However, we ask you to be respectful of others space and keep your distance if you are feeling unwell.
- This year there is a change in the format due to the length of time the new finals take to run.
- It is not possible to fit 8 finals in a day.
- Sunday will be an open competition where there will be no separate competitions for juniors.

We would also like to make you aware that parking at Sport Wales on Saturday 5th may be limited due to the rugby.

Registration and range procedures

- Entry to Sport Wales will be through the side entrance which is on the cricket ground side of the building.
- On arrival, collect your accreditation from the reception area just inside the entrance.
- Please wear your accreditation when in Sport Wales.
- Your accreditation will give you access to the Field of Play where there will be chairs a few metres behind the athletes you coach. Spectators will only be allowed in the centre area of the main hall, plus the viewing areas on floors 1 and 2.
- Lanes 1 to 33 will be available for unofficial training from 16:00 to 20:00 on Thursday. Lanes 34 to 52 will be available once the Rifle competitions have ended.
- The schedule is on our website. We will update it with any changes before the event.
- There will be a designated area in the main hall for athlete preparation where dry firing can take place.
- This area is not to be used for equipment storage.
- Random equipment checks will be carried out after each qualification match.
- Please help us by encouraging athletes to remove their equipment from the firing point as quickly as
 possible after their match.
- Result screens will be in the main hall and official result sheets will be in the reception area.

Finals

- Finals will be in the Jubilee Hall.
- Friday there will be finals for seniors for the AirOShoot quota places and juniors will have their pairs final.
- Saturday there will be finals for juniors for the AirOShoot quota places and seniors will have their pairs final.
- Sunday the finals will be for the Open Championship.
- The finals will be live streamed on You Tube please subscribe and share.

- Medal ceremonies will be immediately after each final.
- The medal ceremony for the Cardiff GP will be after the pairs final
- We are happy to have spectators across all ranges but not in the field of play area.
